What is an entrepreneur?

When the three Gill brothers asked their parents for money to buy Nerf Blasters and a PlayStation 4, their Mom and Dad didn't just hand over the cash. Instead, they said, "Get a job—or start a business." The boys decided to start a business hand-making and selling candles, and Frères Branchiaux (which is pronounced "Frair bron-shee-oh" and means Gill brothers) was born.

With the help of family, the brothers make and sell their products online. Those products have now expanded to include room sprays and soaps too. The business's success has allowed the boys to buy their own toys and learn valuable life skills, like public speaking and empathy (they donate some of their profits to the homeless). And Mom has even added business lessons to their homeschool schedule.
